 bargain and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said John
 Crompler their undivided proportion of Dorer in the land formerly belonging to Jesse Memble
 containing ninety six acres be the same more or less together with all the singular houses buildings
 gardens and orchards &c and the revenues and revenues &c remainder and remainings To have and
 to hold the said undivided proportion of the above named Land with the tenements and appurtenances
 and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold as aforesaid
 parcel thereof as at any of their rights &c to the said John Crompler his heirs and assigns forever
 and the said Joseph M. Memble and Sarah his wife for themselves and their heirs the said parcel of
 Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said John
 Crompler his heirs and assigns free from the claim of claims of them the said Joseph M. Memble
 Sarah his wife or either of them their or either of their heirs their or either of their heirs
