

There is a certain matter of Controversy has been pending between the undersigned and Robert  
 Scollman about an alleged promise of marriage and seduction of the undersigned Elizabeth Brown and the  
 said Scollman and said Elizabeth Scollman being desirous of putting an end to said Controversy have agreed  
 to compromise the same upon the said Elizabeth Scollman paying to the undersigned Robert Brown and William  
 Brown one hundred and fifty dollars on condition that the said Robert Brown will dismiss all suits or actions  
 against said Elizabeth Scollman and that both the undersigned will relinquish and abandon all claim or  
 demand on the said Elizabeth Scollman on account of said Controversy each party paying his own  
 costs that is each to pay all the cost that has accrued on his own side of the said from the commencement  
 thereof to the present day. Now therefore in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration  
 of the said one hundred and fifty dollars the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the undersigned Robert  
 Brown and Elizabeth Brown do acknowledge themselves fully compensated and satisfied for and on account  
 of the said supposed grievances and they and each of them do hereby absolve and acquit the said Elizabeth  
 Scollman from all further claim demand or damages in account of any supposed grievances by either of  
 them sustained by reason of said alleged promise of marriage and seduction and also from all claim  
 or demands for the support or maintenance of the child of the said Elizabeth Brown. Given under

This I do certify made this 18<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord 1830 between William Brown Robert  
 Mercer and Benjamin Cornpley Commissioners appointed by the Honorable Court of Southampton to sell the  
 Land belonging to the infant heirs of William Cornpley dec<sup>d</sup> of the one part and John Mercer of the other  
 both of the County of Southampton Witness that the said William Mercer and Cornpley for and in consideration  
 of twenty five and 0 dollars to them in hand paid by the said John Mercer before the executing and delivering  
 hereof the receipt whereof the said William Mercer and Cornpley Commissioners doth hereby acknowledge which  
 granted bargain and sold and doth by these presents grant bargain and sell unto the said John Mercer  
 his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract and parcel of Land situated lying and being in the County of Southampton  
 it being a part of the lands which West signed and seized and possessed of the said dec<sup>d</sup> or part  
 of Land being the proportion of Sally Tynd daughter of West Tynd to her mother William Cornpley  
 and was the mother of the said infant children namely Maria William and Margaret Cornpley  
 and born on the 1<sup>st</sup> E. by Solomon Cornpley's Land and bounded by the lands of Thomas Colving E. &  
 by West Tynd N. and bounded by land Drington North N. E. And being by estimation fifty two acres  
 or the same more or less And the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders thereto of profits and  
 also the Estate right title interest claim and demand whatsoever of them the said Robert Mercer  
 and Cornpley Commissioners and their heirs forever of us or to the same or in any part thereof To have  
 and to hold the said Land premises with all the appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said John  
 Mercer his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said John Mercer his heirs &  
 assigns forever and the said Robert Mercer and Cornpley Commissioners further said their heirs forever  
 doth covenant promise and grant with the said John Mercer his heirs and assigns by these presents that the  
 said Robert Mercer and Cornpley Commissioners the Land and forever enjoy said land parcel thereof unto  
 the said John Mercer his heirs and assigns against the claim title and demand of them the said Robert  
 Mercer and Cornpley Comm<sup>s</sup> the heirs &c And shall well forever defend what right is vested in them  
 by the date of this Bond bearing date April second 1830. In Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands  
 and faces on this 18<sup>th</sup> day of June third and eight hundred and thirty
