This Indenture made this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of October 1829 between John Johnson of the County of Southampton of the first part Augustus Ballard of the second part and William Johnson of the third part in and to the said John Johnson is partly indebted to the said William Johnson in the sum of Forty dollars and five cents to be paid on the first day of December next as by a Bond bearing date on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of October 1829 which debt with the legal interest thereon accruing the said John Johnson is willing and desires before him this Indenture to be satisfied that for and in consideration of the promises and also for the further satisfaction of the sum of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said John Johnson in hand paid by the said William Johnson at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said John Johnson hath given granted bargained and sold to the said Augustus Ballard their heirs and assigns one cow and six sheats two chest and one trunk one iron pot and oven twelve barrels of Corn 500<sup>l</sup> of fodder To have and to hold the said property with default to be made in the whole or in part of the said sum of Forty dollars and five cents and then upon this further bond the said Augustus Ballard his heirs Executors &c shall and lawfully do after the happening of such default of payment as he may think proper or the said William Johnson his heirs Executors &c shall request sell the said property to the highest bidder for or to any way at public Auction after having fixed the time and place of sale at their own discretion and give ten day notice and out of the money arising from such sale shall after deducting the charges thereof and other expenses attending the premises pay to the said William Johnson his Executors &c the balance of Forty dollars and five cents with the interest which may thereon lawfully have accrued on the balance if any shall pay to the said John Johnson his Executors &c but if the whole of the said sum of Forty dollars and five cents shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said William Johnson his heirs Executors &c on or before the first day of December next when the same is payable so that the default of the payment of the sum of Forty dollar be made then this Indenture to be void and to remain in full force and virtue.
