This Indenture made this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of October 1829 between John Johnson of the County of Southampton  
of the first part Augustus Pollard of the second part and William Johnson of the third part witnesseth the said  
John Johnson is fully indebted to the said William Johnson the sum of Forty dollars and four cents  
to be paid on the first day of December next as by a Bill bearing date on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of October 1828 the  
debt with the legal interest thereon according the said John Johnson is fully and deservedly  
so much Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the promised payment further to be made  
of the sum of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said John Johnson in hand paid by  
the said William Johnson at or before the sealing and delivery of this presents the receipt whereof  
is hereby acknowledged by the said John Johnson hath given grant & bargained and sold to the said  
Augustus Pollard three Bushels and a quarter one bushel and six bushels two bushels and one bushel each  
pot and over to due Barrels of Corn 500 bushels of foader tobacco and to hold the said property  
default to be made in the whole or part of the sum of Forty dollars and four cents and then  
upon and further trust the said Augustus Pollard his heirs Executors &c shall and will be  
bound after the happening of such default of payment as he may think proper or the said William  
Johnson his heirs Executors &c shall request sell the said property to the highest bidder for ready money  
at public Auction after having fixed the time and place of sale at their own discretion and given ten days  
notice and out of the money arising from such sale shall after setting aside the charges of sale and  
other expenses attending the premises pay to the said William Johnson his Executors &c the sum  
of Forty dollars and four cents with the interest which may then or lawfully have accrued with  
balance if any shall pay to the said John Johnson his Executors &c but if the whole of the sum  
of Forty dollars and four cents shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said William Johnson  
his Executors &c on or before the first day of December next when the same is payable to oblige  
default of the payment of the sum of Forty dollars he made this Indenture to be in order  
to remain in full force and virtue In witness whereof the said parties to these presents have  
unto set their hands and sealed the day and year first written

This Indenture made this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of June one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven between  
Wootton and Mary Wootton his mother of the one part and Cha Mellons of the other part all of the County of  
Southampton and State of Virginia witnesseth that the said Joshua Wootton and Mary Wootton  
for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and twenty five dollars unto them in hand paid  
by the said Cha Mellons the receipt whereof the said Joshua Wootton and Mary Wootton doth  
hereby acknowledge themselves fully satisfied and paid and of the same date by this present  
agreed the said Joshua Wootton and Mary Wootton them the said Joshua Wootton and Mary  
Wootton hath granted bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents  
grant bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed unto the said Cha Mellons one certain  
tract plantation or parcel of Land containing by estimation sixteen acres more or less of land  
being situated in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia bounded as follows
