 Jones of the County of Southampton of the one part and Col. Henry Ellis and Robert Stephenson of the County of Sussex
 Trustee of the other. Witnesseth that for and consideration of the sum of twenty dollar by and consent of
 of Virginia hath bargain and sold and by their presents hath bargain and sell unto the said Col. Henry Ellis his
 care and whosoever for his and all of my property of my lands and all my crop to the only proper use and
 behoof of him the said Col. Henry Ellis his heirs and assigns forever But the true intent and meaning of this
 Indenture is that the said Litching Jones stands indebted to the said Col. Henry Ellis the sum of twenty
 dollar current money of Virginia to be paid on or before the first day of May next ensuing and the said
 Litching Jones in writing the said sum of money should be paid unto the said Col. Henry Ellis his heirs or
 assigns if the said Litching Jones his heirs or assigns do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto
 the said Col. Henry Ellis his heirs or assigns the above named sum of twenty dollar on or before the first day of May
 next ensuing together all all contingent charges attending the same then the above Indenture be void and of no effect
 but if the said sum of twenty dollar and the contingent charges attending the same shall not be paid on or before
 the first day of May next ensuing then the above named Robert Stephenson may enter upon and possess the
 above mentioned property and make sale thereof at public Auction for ready money on giving ten days previous
 notice and pay the said Col. Henry Ellis the sum above mentioned with lawful interest thereon till paid
 together with all contingent charges attending the same and the balance of any pay and deliver unto the said
