Boykin for and in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred and fifty dollars Current money to him in hand paid by the said Trotter before the making and delivering hereof the receipt whereof the said Samuel G. Boykin doth hereby acknowledge and give
bargained and sold and delivered by these presents grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Trotter his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract and parcel of Land situated lying and being in the County of Southampton in the aforesaid district of Portway Parish by me and bounded by Trotter Swamp on the East adjoining the Land of John Browne on the South West by the Land of David G. Boykin West by the Land of Roberton Daniel touching the lands of David G. Boykin touching the land of Boykin Chapel containing by estimation two hundred and twenty acres more or less being the tract heretofore known as or by what name so ever my factor said Boykin in his last Will and Testament wherein
remained and forfeited thereof also all the Estate Right title interest claim and demand whatsoever of the said Samuel G. Boykin and his heirs from of or and to the same or in any part thereof to have and to hold the said Land and premises with the appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said Thomas Trotter his heirs and assigns forever And the said Samuel G. Boykin for his part has been executors and testators both bargained promise and grant with the said Thomas Trotter his heirs and assigns by these presents the said Samuel G. Boykin the said Land and premises every part and parcel thereof to the said Thomas Trotter his heirs and assigns against the lawful claim title and demand of the said Samuel G. Boykin his heirs and all and every other person or persons who or own shall and will remain and forever defend by these presents In Witness whereof I the said Samuel G. 3rd Indenture made the 25th day of November in the Year of our Lord Christ one thousand Eight hundred and Twenty Eight Between Patrick Doole & his wife Emily of the first part and and Martha Lone and her children James Jones, Calmy Jones, Elizabeth and McNamee Jones of the second part witnesseth that the said Patrick Doole and his wife in consideration of the sum of one hundred and forty dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Martha Lone and her children James Jones, Elizabeth and McNamee Jones at or before the making and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do and make of them both bargain and sell unto the said Martha Lone and her children James Jones, Elizabeth and McNamee Jones to them their heirs and assigns a certain tract of Land containing eighty five and $\frac{1}{4}$ acres with all its conveniences and bounds as follows. Bounded on the South side by Patrick Doole Land Beginning at a pine tree standing on the side of the road leading from the said Doole to Drur's old store and then goes in a straight line of rock walls to a P. Gun in the Branch then up Terpin Branch to Wootton Daniel house then thence by the said Daniel land on the North side and on the West by the land of George Melton and Samuel Wootton land on the road leading from the said Doole to Drur's old store To have and to hold the said tract of Land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the franchises before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof full and every of their right members and appurtenances unto the said Martha Lone and her children
