Boyle of the County of Southampton of the one part and Thomas Pittler of the same County of the other Witnesseth that the said Samuel G. Boyle for and in consideration of the sum of Eight Hundred and fifty dollars current money to him in hand paid by Thomas Pittler before the writing and delivering of the receipt whereof the said Samuel G. Boyle doth hereby acknowledge and bargain and sell and doth by these presents grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Pittler his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract and parcel of Land situated lying and being in the County of Southampton in the upper district of the May Parish by my and to be sold by Jackson Emery on the East adjoining the Land of John Brine on the North West by the Land of David Pittler West by the Land of Newton Daniel South by the Land of David Pittler South West by the Land of Byrd Marvel containing by estimation between and adjoining acres more or less being the tract that I now live on together with my my father's old plantation in the last 1800 and the woods and various curians and profits thereof also all the State right title and use claim and demand whatsoever of the said Samuel G. Boyle and his heirs forever in and to the same or in any part thereof to have and to hold the said Land and premises with the appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said Thomas Pittler his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of the said Thomas Pittler his heirs and assigns forever and the said Samuel G. Boyle for his part his heirs executor administrator doth covenant promise and grant with the said Thomas Pittler his heirs and assigns together present and the said Samuel G. Boyle the said Land and premises every part and parcel thereof unto the said Thomas Pittler his heirs and assigns against the lawful claim title and demand of him the said Samuel G. Boyle his heirs and all and every other person persons to his own death and Well Warrant and forever defend by these presents. In Witness whereof I the said Samuel G. This Indenture made the 25th day of November in the Year of our Lord Christ one thousand Eight Hundred and twenty Eight between Patrick Dols and his wife Emily of the first part and Martha Lore and her children James Lore Henry Lore Elizabeth and William Lore of the second part Witnesseth that the said Patrick Dols and his wife in consideration of the sum of one hundred and forty dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Martha Lore and her children James Henry Elizabeth and William Lore at or before the writing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargain and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said Martha Lore and her children James Henry Elizabeth and William Lore to their heirs and assigns a certain tract of Land containing eighty five and 7/8 acres with all its curians and appurtenances bounded as follows Bounded on the North side by Patrick Dols Land Beginning at a pine corner tree standing on the side of the road leading from the said Dols to Drury's old store and then goes a straight line of marked stakes to a 13 Gum or Sycamore Branch then up Terpin Branch to Barton Daniel line then bounded by the said Daniel line on the North side and on the West by the land of George Meadows and Samuel Mitchell and on the road leading from the said Dols to Drury's old store Thence and to hold the said parcel of Land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises and appurtenances or intended to be bargain and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights members and appurtenances unto the said Martha Lore and her children
