This Indenture made this 30 day of July in the year of our Lord 1830 between Joseph Soyner of the County of Southampton of the one part, and Reyd Summer of the County of the other part Whereas the said Joseph Soyner is justly indebted to John Moore in a Bond of Ten dollars pay able on the 25 day of December next in which said bond and whereas the said Soyner is desirous to secure the said Summer harmless from all and every claim of the sum of one dollar to him in said bond by the said Reyd Summer before the said day of delivery hereof the receipt whereof the said Soyner hereby acknowledges the said Soyner hath granted bargained and sold to and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Reyd Summer and to his heirs and assigns forever all the right of Corn growing use and behoof of him the said Reyd Summer his himself Soyner and the said Joseph Soyner for himself doth covenant and agree to and with the said Summer that the Corn aforesaid with all the privilege appertaining thereunto the said Reyd Summer his himself Soyner freed from the claim or claims of him the said Joseph Soyner his heirs and all other persons claiming by or under him or them shall and will by these presents remain and forever defend provided nevertheless that if the said Joseph Soyner his heirs Executors administrators do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said John Moore or his Executor or assigns the aforesaid sum of Ten dollars with all interest and costs on or before the 25 day of December next then and in such case this Indenture and all the aforesaid covenants granted and every clause and sentence herein contained shall also determine and be utterly void to all intents and purposes any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding. This Indenture made and entered into on this 19th day of January in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty by and between Corry Whitfield of the County of Boston State of Virginia of the first part Thomas Evertt of the County of Southampton State of Virginia of the second part and Nicholas Poon of the County of Bedford and State of North Carolina of the third and last part This Indenture sheweth as well as a Bond of an even date herewith that this said Corry Whitfield is due and owing to the said Nicholas Poon the sum of five hundred and fifty dollars due and owing from the date hereof with interest thereon till paid which debt and interest he the said Corry Whitfield is willing to secure and secure the payment thereof to him the said Nicholas Poon from thereof and for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him the said Corry Whitfield in his hand paid by him the said Thomas Evertt the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged and from every part of which he the said Thomas Evertt and all his legal representatives are forever released is or shall be the said Corry Whitfield have hereby bargained and sold unto the said Thomas Evertt his heirs and assigns the following named articles of property Viz the Ray horse three glass and glass one walnut chest one pine chest eight dining chairs one cast iron stove one and eight pine two sets and hooks one dutch oven one spade one broom one looking glass one set of tinware two pans one long one black blade fodder one pan one butter one set of knives and forks one set of spoons a parcel of Carthen ware thirty barrels corn fifteen barrels of Pork farming utensils two and three wood ing hoes one hand saw two saws and
