This Indenture made this 23rd day of April 1830 Between Susan Olives of the County of
Southampton of the first part John Carroll of the County of Essex of the second part and Joseph
Carroll of the County of Essex of the third part Witnesseth that whereas the said Susan Olives is
justly indebted to the said John Carroll by note executed by the said Susan Olives to the
said John Carroll for the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars payable 21st day of April 1831 and dated
21st of April 1830 and which said note is regularly assigned by the said John Carroll to the said
Joseph Carroll and which assignment bears its date with this indenture and the said Susan Olives
being willing and desirous of securing the said sum of money to the said John Carroll
as well for the promise aforesaid as for the further consideration of one dollar to her paid
by the said Joseph Carroll before the signing and delivery of these presents the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged each granted bargained sold and delivered and by their
presents doth grant bargain sell and deliver to the said Joseph Carroll his heirs Executors
administrators and assigns forever the following slaves viz Tom a Boy about 18 years
old Betty a girl about fifteen years old To have and to hold the said slaves to the
only proper use and behoof of him the said Joseph Carroll his heirs Executors adminis-
trators and assigns forever And the said Susan Olives for herself her heirs Executors and
administrators the rights and title to the said slaves unto the said Joseph Carroll his heirs
Executors administrators and assigns against the claim of herself or against the claim of any other
person shall and well forever release and defend by these presents Upon these presents
that it is the true intent and meaning of these presents that if the said Susan Olives
Executors or administrators shall fail to pay to the said Joseph Carroll the amount of the note
said at the time aforesaid then it may and shall be lawful for the said Joseph Carroll and his
heirs to sell to the highest bidder for Cash so many of the aforesaid slaves as shall be sufficient
to satisfy the said interest and costs and out of the sale aforesaid pay the amount of the note
aforesaid together with any costs which may have accrued in carrying the same into
effect and the surplus if any pay over to the said Susan Olives her heirs or assigns In Witness
