Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia and his successors in Office for the true sum of seven thousand dollars the payment whereof well and truly to be made to the said Governor and his successors we bind ourselves and each of us and each of our heirs Executors and assigns heirs jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 20 day of September 1830.

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound Richard P. Nicholson is by the Court appointed a Constable in the District of Saint Luke's Parish in the County of Southampton. Now therefore if the said Richard P. Nicholson shall well and truly do execute and perform the Office of Constable aforesaid within the said District according to Law then this obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force and effect.

Bittles executed to William Briggs during after 4th for the benefit of Francis M. Boykin and of Henry Briggs dec^d for the sum of Eight hundred and twenty two dollars and twenty three cents one executed to John McQuibart for the sum of two hundred and twenty dollars and forty nine cents also the further sum of about two hundred dollars due by Bonds to David S. Boykin and the notes due to John Boykin for the sum of about thirty dollars and the said Samuel P. Boykin being desirous of saving harm to the said David S. Boykin and John Boykin for the debts aforesaid and the notes due to them respectively have granted conveyed and sold and by these presents do grant convey and sell unto the said Edward P. Bittles his heirs Executors and assigns forever the following property One Negro woman named Aggy One Negro woman named Ancho One Negro woman named Duckey One Negro man named Polbut one Mare Stock of Cattle sheep and sheep house hold and kitchen furniture plantation tools and two stiles three cedar presses One apple wood cedar Runnel One sheeps head Bands crop of Corn four and cotton and Brand upon that nevertheless that if the said Samuel P. Boykin shall at any time the aforesaid debts and the interest and cost that may grow due thereon then the said Edward P. Bittles shall release to the said Samuel P. Boykin all the property herein named but in default of such payment at any time after seven judgments shall be obtained on the aforesaid forthcoming Bonds the said Edward P. Bittles his heirs Executors and assigns shall when required by the said Samuel P. Boykin David S.
