The Indenture made the third day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty between Elisha Danvers of the one part and William Lawrence of the other subscriber of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia witnesseth that the said Elisha Danvers grants in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to him on hand paid by the said William Lawrence to before the concluding and delivery of these presents therewith to him by a foregoing day the said Elisha Danvers hath granted bargained and sold unto the said William Lawrence a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and lying on the west side of the road leading from Southway to Monroe Beginning at a Black gum standing on the said road a corner on the bank of the late Henry Parsons and thence N 25 W 24 poles to a post a corner off the said land thence S 35 E 114 poles to a post a corner thence S 35 E a long narrow marked tree 65 p to a low wood and dry wood at the aforesaid road thence along the road the distance containing 135 poles to the beginning containing fifty acres more or less the reversion & remainder remaineth and to commandments yearly and heretofore upon and after thereof and every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises known before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof unto the said William Lawrence his heirs & assigns forever And the said Elisha Danvers for himself and his heirs the said tract or parcel of land with all and singular the premises appurtenances before mentioned unto the said William Lawrence his heirs and assigns from the claim of him the said Elisha Danvers his heirs and assigns and of all and every other person or persons whatsoever shall arise and do bear and do forwardly these presents In witness whereof the said Elisha Danvers hath hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year as first above written
