William Lawrence and Samuel Story of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia of the one part and William E Lawrence of the aforesaid County and State of the other part Wm McBeth Esq. witness by an interlocutory decree made enters in the County Court of Southampton August Court 1830 in a cause lately depending in said Court between James Wells and Margaret Wells infant children of John Wells dec'd by William Lawrence their next friend plaintiffs against William Wells and Margaret Wells defendants. It ordains and decrees that William E Lawrence William Lawrence and Samuel Story or any two of them layff to the widow of John Wells Margaret Wells one third part of the tract of land in the Bell Meeting for her life after her death and after giving due notice sell to the highest bidder on a trial of nine months except so much as may be necessary to defray the expenses hereof the other two thirds together with the reversion in the 1/3rd on third after her death and after defraining the aforesaid necessary expenses to take there Bond of equal amounts with good security and pay them over as annutes by the said decree. It being the tract and parcel of land John Wells and his wife proposed of lying in the lower part of Witterney Parish Containing by Survey eight and one fourth acres and is bounded as follows. Bdy.
