This Indenture made and entered into this the 4 day of October in the year one thousand Eight hundred and thirty. Between Robert Gororin of the County of Southampton of the one part and Henry B. Maugham of the same County of the other part. Whereas it is agreed between the said Robert Gororin and the said Henry B. Maugham that the said Robert Gororin for and in consideration of the sum of Three Thousand dollars to him欠is paid by the said Henry B. Maugham the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath given grants bargained and sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell unto the said Henry B. Maugham his heirs and assigns of the said Henry B. Maugham all the land and premises situate and lying in the Town of Southampton subject however to the leases herein after mentioned to wit Lots 1 & 20 in the Town of Southampton which said lots together with a certain piece of land (which land has been conveyed by the said Gororin to John Thomas) the said Robert Gororin purchased at the sale made pursuant to a decree of the Chancery Court of Williamsburg and was conveyed by William McCandless Marshall of the said Superior Court of Chancery as per Deed bearing date the 23rd day of November 1825. and duly recorded in Southampton County Court abstracts of Lots 1 & 20 in the Town of Southampton a record of which the said Gororin became the purchaser and was conveyed to him by Deeds duly recorded in Southampton County Court from Joseph B. Whitehead Deputy Marshall of the Superior Court of Chancery for the Williamsburg District and the said Gororin's interest in the said Lots was subsequently acquired during a term of the County Court of Southampton referred to the said Deeds which bear date the 3rd day of June 1828 and to the report of the Commissioners which was made in August 1828 will more fully explain also a little lot purchased by the said Gororin of John Rick which was allotted to the said Rick by the Deed of the County Court aforesaid before to the Deed from the said Rick to the said Gororin which is dated the 1st day of September 1828 and duly recorded will more fully explain. Also a piece of land purchased by the said Gororin of the said Joseph B. Whitehead Deputy Marshall of the Superior Court of Chancery and at a sale made under a decree of the said Superior Court in a suit depending between John Thomas Applewhite, Collier M. Barnes et al v. John P. Wilkinson and John Bryant and others against Henry Briggs et al of Brixton and adjoining the land formerly Samuel Stiles's house on the back East by the road leading to Blackwater Bridge from junction and on the North East by the Road running from the lands of John Thomas (which he purchased of the said Robert Gororin) up to a common between said land and John Thomas's land near the Bee Field meeting James Richell's line then along James Richell's line to the line of Sugars Bryant which may be known by reference to a Deed from the said Gororin to the said Bryant bearing Bryant's line to the road leading from Peterstring to Scudallow thence down the said road to Green's Bogard's line it also adjoins the lands belonging to the Estate of James Wilkinson et al referred to the Deed further Joseph B. Whitehead to the said Gororin dated the 3rd day of June 1828 the said land will be more fully explained. Also a lot of land in the County of Southampton adjoining the Town of Southampton aforesaid bounded by the lot of Lewis C. Ferguson formerly Price and Land formerly Miller referred to a Deed from Joseph B. Whitehead Deputy Marshall &c to said Gororin dated the 1st June 1828 and duly recorded the boundaries of the said land will fully appear and the remains and remains remaining and remainder of all and singular the said tract and lots of land hereby granted aforesaid to be hereby granted and every part and parcel thereof of subject however to the following leases reserved to the said Henry B. Maugham as to enter upon and take possession of the premises aforesaid to the first day of January one thousand Eight hundred and thirty one except the house referred to James S. Smith and George E. Hines and to take possession of them at the time of their respective leases which may be ascertained from the Deeds of Lease duly recorded in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County Court and except also the house at present used as a Sheriff's Office which the said Gororin is not to have possession of until June 1832 and the said Gororin likewise sells and conveys unto the said Henry B. Maugham all the furniture etc belonging to the Tavern to have and to hold the aforesaid lots and parcels of land with the tenements houses etc an all and singular other premises herein before mentioned subject to the reservation of possession before mentioned as intended to be bargained and sold and also the furniture aforesaid unto the said Henry B. Maugham his heirs and assigns forever. To and for the only proportion and share of him the said Henry B.
