Cland by bond bearing date to the 15th day of October one thousand Eight hundred and thirty as also for and in consideration of one debt to him in hand paid by the said Horace Hamis and the receipt whereof the said Peter Pope acknowledgeably acknowledge such grants bargained and sold and by these presents doth hereby grant bargain and sell Convey and make over unto the said Horace Hamis and his heirs forever all his right and interest in the following property unto a certain negro named the name of Peter a Cooper by trade also one other negro boy by the name of Randolph belonging to him the said Peter Pope To have and to hold with all the rights and interest of the said Peter Pope herein Conveyed or intended to be Conveyed to him the said Horace Hamis his heirs and assigns forever upon the Special trust notwithstanding that the said Horace Hamis upon being thereto required by the said Joseph E. Cland shall proceed to sell all the right and interest of the said Peter Pope to the above named property hereby Conveyed or intended to be Conveyed after advertising the time and place in the said County of Southampton for ten days previous at some public house or store for Cattle and out of the monies arising out of from the said sale in the first place pay and settle by all costs attending the said sale as well as the expense attending the said Conveyance and pay off the debt aforesaid with interest and the surplus if any left to the said Peter Pope and the said Peter Pope for himself his heirs and assigns by the right and title of the said Peter Pope Negro slaves unto the said Horace Hamis his heirs and assigns forever with hereby warrant and defend against the lawful claim or claims of him the said Peter Pope his heirs executors and administrators and against all and every other person or persons whomsoever. And the said Horace Hamis in part countermands and agrees that he will make sale of the right and interest hereby Conveyed for the best price he can obtain for the same after advertising the time and place for ten days previous at some public house or store in the said County and with the monies arising from the said sale first pay and satisfy all costs attending same as well as the expense attending the Conveyance and then pay off the aforesaid debt and interest and then pay the overplus if any to the said Joseph E. Cland and the said Joseph E. Cland on his part Convents and agrees that he will release the said negro slaves from the obligation of this instrument upon the said Peter Pope paying him the amount of the aforesaid debt with interest. I will then give him the parts to these presents hereunto set their hands and seal the day and year first above written

eth that the said Roberton C. Williford and Nancy his wife in consideration of the sum of one thousand eight hundred
of lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Ervin Williford at or before the
executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold
and by these presents do and take of them both burgage and freehold unto the said Ervin Williford his heirs and
assigns all their interest in the land and plantation wherein John Sim Williford did containing by
Estimation One hundred and thirty two acres more or less bounded west and south by Rigo's Hill and
east and south by the land formerly Sotter Ballen's with the appurtenances thereof
