other part witnesseth that the said Richard Vick and Martha Am his wife for consideration after
sum of Threecro hundredd dollars to them in hand paid by the said William D Hobbs at or before the making
and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold
and by these presents doth bargaine and sell unto the said William D Hobbs his heirs and assigns
a certain tract of land containing three hundred and thirty three acres lie the same more or less lying
and situate in the County of Southampton and Parish of Totmonrow bearing the tract of Land or
which the said Richard Vick and Martha Am had formerly laid and bounded by the lands of Henry
Briggs Robert Rawlings, Jeremiah Cobb and the heirs of Joseph Drury and together with all and
singular the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining and the revenue and running
rents and remainders yearly and other rents, issues and profits therefrom to have and to hold the
said tract of land with the appurtenances unto the said William D Hobbs his heirs and assigns joint
And the said Richard Vick and Martha Am his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract
land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said William
D Hobbs his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of them the said Richard Vick and Martha
Am his wife or either of them their or either of their heirs and of all and every person or persons whomsoever
shall arise and do warrant and defend by these presents In Wm eff whereof the said Richard
Vick and Martha Am his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year just
above written
