DeHors of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Richard Vick and Martha Ann his wife in consideration of the sum of Three hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said William D. DeHors at or before the signing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged Have bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said William D. DeHors his heirs and assigns a certain tract of land containing three hundred and thirty three acres be the same more or less lying and situate in the County of Southampton and Parish of Northham it being the tract of Land in which the said Richard Vick and Martha Ann his wife formerly lived and borne in by the lands of Henry Briggs Robert Rawlings Samuel Cobb and the heirs of Joseph Drury and together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining and the reversion and remainder and remainder in reversion and other rents, issues and profits thereof To have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances unto the said William D. DeHors his heirs and assigns forever And the said Richard Vick and Martha Ann his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract of land with all and singular the promises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said William D. DeHors his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of them the said Richard Vick and Martha Ann his wife or either of them their or either of their heirs and of all and every person or persons who shall arise and so warrant and defend by these presents In Witness whereof the said Richard Vick and Martha Ann his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written
