 This Indenture was made by the oath of Henry Bond, one of the Justices of the Peace for the County of Southampton, and having been sworn in in the Clerk's Office the 9th day of August 1830 by the oath of Stephen Munday and George H. Gray also sworn in the Clerk's Office the 9th day of August 1830, by James Rochelle the other Justices, and admitted to be a Justice of the Peace for the County of Southampton the 15th day of November 1830. The said Justice was sworn upon the two corners of the day

This Indenture made and entered into the 11th day of August 1830. Between Thomas Gray of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and James Rochelle of the same County and State of the second part. And Orrin A. Bromo of the same County and State of the third part. Witness that whereas the said Thomas Gray has conveyed certain property in a deed of trust to James Rochelle as trustee for the said Orrin A. Bromo for consideration therein specified and leave being granted the said Gray by the said Bromo to dispose of any property therein conveyed in any manner he might think proper for cash provided the money so obtained be applied to the discharge or part or in whole of the debt for which the said Bromo is bound, with the said Gray, now the said Gray having disposed of a part of the property so conveyed to one negro boy, Charles, and was bound to apply the money to a different purpose than what was first agreed on, the said Bromo has agreed that it may be so applied provided the said Gray convey to him other property to the value of the said boy, Charles, to be appropriated to the same use that it was intended he should have been. In consideration of which and for the further consideration of one dollar and paid to him the said Gray by the said Rochelle, at or before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Gray, he the said Gray has granted conveyed and sold and conveyed, and by these presents does grant convey sell and convey, to the said Rochelle his Executor or administrators the following property, to-wit: one negro man named and called Daniel Bath, To have and to hold the said negro Daniel to him the said Rochelle his Executor or administrators &c. forever. The consideration of the above obligation is such that it is intended that the above property is to substitute the boy who has been sold from the said Bromo is at any time liable to suffer any loss injury or in consequence or account of the said boy expressed in the deed to which this has allusion and which bears date 7th day of August 1830. Then the said Rochelle shall at the request of within the said Bromo or the said Gray expose the said negro Daniel to public sale for cash after having given fifteen days notice of the time and place of such sale and out of the money arising from such sale appropriate the sum of Five hundred and sixty five dollars that being the amount for which the boy Charles sold is the discharge of the debt specified in the Deeds to which this has allusion and the said boy expended attending this indenture as well the sale of said negro and the remainder of any money to the said Gray or any person authorized to receive it for him. Upon that receipt of the said Rochelle shall not sell the above property except by agreement to do so by the said Bromo or the said Gray. And if the said Gray does not and truly pay and discharge the debt above alluded to without any injury loss or in consequence or account of the said Bromo within a year after the above obligation is made and void then it is to remain in full force and virtue in testimony whereof the parties have hereunto set their hands and seals the 11th day of August 1830.
