the sum of Two Thousand Dollars to which payment well and truly to be made to the said President and  
Directors of the Literary Fund and their Successors in Office we bind ourselves  
and Executors and Administrators jointly and severally for ever by these presents to pay and discharge  
unto the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November 1830. The Condition of the above obligation is such that when  
the above named Silas Summells uses on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1830 by the Clerk Commissioner  
in and for the County of Southampton appointed their Treasurer for the year ending the 31<sup>st</sup> of  
December 1830 a sum of the said Silas Summells shall lawfully apply and account for  
all monies which may come to his hands by virtue of his Office and shall do perform and  
execute all and every act and thing appertaining to his said Office according to Law than  
the above obligation to be void unless to remain in full force and virtue

Witnesseth that the said Obigekiah Bradshaw and Latitia his wife Johnson  
Pope and John Clegg for and in Consideration of the sum of Two Hundred  
Twenty dollars lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by  
the said Oberry Harris at or before the sealing and delivery of these pres-  
ents the receipt whereof the said Obigekiah Bradshaw and Latitia his wife  
Johnson Pope and John Clegg doth hereby acknowledge have been made  
sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell  
unto the said Oberry Harris his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel  
of land lying and being in the Parish and County aforesaid containing by  
estimation Ninety seven acres be the same more or less lying on the North side  
of Black Creek and bounded as follows Beginning at a Lightwood just  
a corner of Lawrence Souner and the Morrell Lands to called thence 139<sup>ft</sup>  
12<sup>ft</sup> pole to a Maple in Black Creek thence the said Couse of land back  
downwards to a corner between Matthew Bull's line thence along the said Bull's line  
leaving said creek at 13<sup>ft</sup>. to a pine a corner thence at 83<sup>ft</sup>. to a run <sup>a corner</sup> of bounded  
trees to the Beginning. It being a part Lawrence Souner's <sup>deceased</sup> tract of Land  
sold under a decree of the Court with all the houses and houses thereunto  
belonging and all the lands and lands thereunto belonging to the said  
land belonging or in anywise appertaining to the same or any part  
thereof to have and to hold the said 97 acres of Land with all  
singular the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be held with  
every of their rights members and appurtenances unto the said Oberry Harris
