Gury having been legally seized upon to execute the trust so above in him as aforesaid proceeded to sell the aforesaid tract of Land according to Law when the said Littlebury Madon in England Highest bidder became the purchaser thereof for the sum of One thousand dollars and the said John M. Gury is willing to execute as far as the aforesaid Deed of Trust justified him in this Indenture made this 20th of December 1820 between John M. Gury of the one part and Littlebury Madon of the other part both of Southampton County and State of Virginia Witnesseth that the said John M. Gury for and in consideration of the sum of One thousand dollars to him or him paid by the said Madon the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged at and before the executing and delivery of these presents. hath granted bargained and sold and do by these presents grant bargain and sell to him the said Littlebury Madon the aforesaid tract of Land containing as aforesaid ninety acres or the same more or less and bounded as aforesaid To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land to him the said Madon and his heirs forever and the said John M. Gury for him self his heirs Executors of all his right title claim or demand and the right title claim or demand of or in and to the aforesaid tract of Land and promised then of which he derived title to under the before mentioned deed of Trust from the said Charles M. Gwynne together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining unto the said Littlebury Madon his heirs &c. with hereby forever warrant such title and deeds only as may go in to him by the said Trust aforesaid In Witness whereof the said John M.
