 The Indenture made and entered into on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of December in the  
 year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty between Joseph Jordan and  
 Rebecca Jordan his wife both of the County of Southampton and State of Vir-  
 ginia of the one part and Richard Jordan of the same County and State of Virginia  
 part Witnesseth that the said Joseph Jordan and Rebecca his wife for &  
 in consideration of the sum of seven hundred and eighty four dollars (and some  
 of this communicated to them in hand paid by the said Richard Jordan and a  
 before the sealing) and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby  
 acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents they and each  
 of them doth grant bargain and sell along in full and confirm unto him the  
 said Richard Jordan his heirs and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel  
 of Land situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and  
 Parish of Saint Luke's containing by estimation One hundred and sixty  
 few acres be the same more or less it being the Land and plantation whereon  
 the said Joseph Jordan did reside and conned as follows to wit Beginning  
 at a Black Gum standing near the corner of William's Swamp a corner for  
 Sully Meek in Lewis Worrell's line thence along said Sully Meek's line of  
 marked trees to a post oak a corner for Maney Meek's John Hargrave's line  
 thence thence along said John Hargrave's line of marked trees to a Black Gum  
 standing in one corner of the said William's Swamp a corner for Christian Jordan
