Upon Trust nevertheless that the said wife Drury by being instructed by the said John C. Turner that he was in danger of suffering by undue severity aforesaid that it shall and may be lawful for him the said wife Drury to advise by giving ten days notice at the common publick place of the time and place of sale and proceed to sell at publick auction for cash all such interest in property hereby conveyed or intended to be Conveyed both as to the property now in my possession and the interest which I may have in the slaves of Patty Reed and out of the proceeds of such sale first pay and satisfy all legal expenses attending the carrying this deed into effect then pay and satisfy all such debts hereby bound that may be at that time due in any part thereof and all costs attending such summy debts the parts to the said John C. Turner or in satisfaction of the above several debts and the balance if any pay to the said John W.
