 consideration of the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars to them in hand paid
 the said George Johnson the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged & have
 given granted bargained and sold unto the said George Johnson and his heirs
 one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in old way Parish in said
 County of Southampton aforesaid containing by estimation one hundred and thirty
 two and a half acres more or less bounded as follows beginning a corner tree in
 John Joyner's line in the Cypress swamp thence along said line north to a pine
 in Sarah Draper's line near the road all the Quaker road thence by said
 Draper's land to a pine a corner tree in Thomas Hemmings thence along said
 Hemmings to a Branch called the Mobile Branch thence along the said Branch
 to a Black gum in Harris on S. Griffin's estate thence along said line to a pine
