This Indenture made on the 5th day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty one Between James Blythe and Amy his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and Thomas W. Jeyner of the County and State aforesaid of the other part. Wherein it is declared that the said James Blythe and Amy his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and eighty five dollars. Current money of Virginia in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas W. Jeyner and his heirs a certain tract or parcel of Land in the County of Southampton aforesaid being the same Land which the said James Blythe purchased of Thomas Brock and Polly his wife as by their Deed of bargain and sell and is of record in the County Court of Southampton containing by estimation thirty seven and a half acres be the same more or less and bounded by the lands of Thomas Fiddler Alfred Hicks John Drake George P. no and James Blythe's other Land. as a reference to the Deed from Thomas E. Brock last recd will more fully explain To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land unto the said Thomas W. Jeyner his heirs and assigns forever. and the said James Blythe and his wife Amy their Execution and administration the said tract or parcel of Land. with all and every its appurtenances unto him the said Thomas W. Jeyner his heirs and assigns shall and will lawfully warrant and defend by these presents. And the said James Blythe and Amy his wife for and in consideration of the above named sum in hand paid by the said Thomas Jeyner doth acknowledge themselves fully satisfied paid and paid their grant bargain and sold. alienated and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas W. Jeyner his heirs and assigns forever. the said tract or parcel of Land adjoining the above named tract and containing two and a half acres being the same Land purchased by the said James Blythe of Thomas E. Brock as tenant by the County as by reference to the Deed now of record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County aforesaid.
