provis<sup>d</sup>) release unto Joseph T. Claid his Execution adm<sup>r</sup> and assigns forever all right  
title interest and claim which I have to the said Slave Edith and Tom and unto  
Deed of Trust aforesaid In Testimony whereof the said Seps Drury and John K.  
Turner have here set their hands and affixed their seals this 21<sup>st</sup> day of March 1831

John Drury his Exec<sup>r</sup> adm<sup>r</sup> and assigns forever all right title interest and claim  
which I have to the said Slave named Reddicks and in the Deed of Trust aforesaid
