This Indenture made this 29th day of November in the year Eighteen hundred and
thirty between Robert Drury acting as Trustee of the County of Southampton and State
of Virginia of the one part, and Henry Lenox of the aforesaid County of the other part
Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and twelve dollars
unto him in hand paid at or before the enclosing and delivery of these
present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Robert Drury
having previously advertised and given ten days notice of the same has been
gained and sold publicly for the best price that could be obtained and by
these presents does bargain and sell unto the said Henry Lenox all right title
interest and claim whosoever in him as Trustee to the tract of Land whereon the late John
Lately resided and which was conveyed by him the said John Lately by Deed of Trust
bearing date the 22^d of March 1828. to Robert Drury as Trustee for the benefit
of Henry Lenox lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by
estimation two hundred and forty four acres more or less and bounded as follows
by the lands of Anthony Bull on the North Samuel Bennett on the East
Benjamin Griffin South and William Griffin and Martha Bradshaw and
together with all and singular the appurtenances with the revenues and services
remainder and remainders yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof and
of every part and parcel thereof To have and to hold the said tract or parcel
of Land with the Tenements hereunto annexed and all and singular other the premises
