

Holloman Indenture This Indenture made this day of in the year of our Lord 1831
 To Samuel and thirty one between Arthur Holloman of the first part Joseph I. Womble
 of the second part and Benjamin L. Drury of the third part. Whereas the said Joseph
 I. Womble on the 17th day of August in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred 3 and
 twenty nine in order to secure the payment of the sum of twenty seven dollars to the
 said Benjamin L. Drury did by Indenture of Trust of that date convey to the said
 Arthur Holloman the tract or parcel of Land whereon the said Joseph I. Womble
 now resides upon trust for the use and purposes in the said Indenture mentioned
 And whereas since the executing and delivering of the said Deed of Trust the said
 Joseph I. Womble hath partly satisfied the said Benjamin L. Drury the sum of
 money thereby secured which the said Benjamin L. Drury doth hereby acknowledge
 And this Indenture Witnesseth that for the consideration aforesaid as well as for the
 further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said Joseph I. Womble to the
 said Arthur Holloman at and before the executing and delivering of these presents the
 receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Arthur Holloman with the
 assent and approbation of the said Benjamin L. Drury signified by his being party
 to these presents and the said Benjamin L. Drury have granted bargained and sold
 promised released and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain and sell
 promise release and confirm unto the said Joseph I. Womble a small part of the
 above named Land which part is situated and bounded as follows Beginning in the
 Proctor road at the land John Crumpler purchased of Thomas Peter and running
 up said road a small distance say thirty or forty yards to a small gum tree then
 leaving said road and running Southwardly say between one and two hundred yards
 to a small pine in old field newly chopped at corner thence westerly to the
 said John Crumpler's line supposed to contain between two and a half and three
 acres To have and to hold the said small piece of Land of between two and a
 half and three acres to the said Joseph I. Womble his heirs and assigns forever
 to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Joseph I. Womble his heirs and
 assigns forever And the said Arthur Holloman and Benjamin L. Drury for
 themselves their heirs &c. the above mentioned small piece of Land unto the said
 Joseph I. Womble his heirs and assigns in as full and ample manner as the same
 was warranted by the said Joseph I. Womble by the Deed of Trust above recited
 do warrant the same to the said Joseph I. Womble against the claim or claims of
 them the said Arthur Holloman and Benjamin L. Drury and all persons claiming
 by or under them or either of them In Witness whereof the parties to these pre-
 sents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day on 3 year first
 above written
