This Indenture made this 4th day of December in the year of our Lord 1830
 between Solomon Blythe and Nancy his wife of the County of Southampton and State of
 Virginia of the one part and William Davis of the aforesaid County and State of
 the other part. Witnesseth that the said Solomon Blythe and Nancy his wife
 in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars lawful money of Virginia then
 in hand paid by the said William Davis at or before the undersigned and delivery
 of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and
 sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said William Davis his heirs
 and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land together with all and singular the
 appurtenances therunto belonging situate lying and being in the County aforesaid
 and being the same whereon the said Solomon Blythe now resides containing one
 hundred and fifty five acres be the same more or less but which were more fully and at
 large appear by referring to a Deed from the Commissioners appointed by the Court
 of Southampton to make sale of the lands formerly the property of John Francis dead
 to John Richlor and from said John Richlor to the said John Blythe senior
 from the said John Blythe Jr. to John Blythe Jr. the first deed bearing date
 the 21st of November 1800. the next bearing date 21st May 1801 and the last bearing date
 21st of January 1811. references being had as aforesaid the boundaries thereof well
 appear. To Have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land together with all and
 singular the appurtenances therunto belonging unto him the said William Davis his
 heirs and assigns to him and their use and behoof forever. And the said Solomon Blythe
 and Nancy his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract or parcel of Land
 with all and singular the appurtenances unto the said William Davis his heirs
 and assigns forever free from the claims of them the said Solomon Blythe and
 Nancy his wife or either of them their or either of their heirs and of all and
 every person or persons whatsoever. Shall will and do warrant and forever
 defend by these presents. In Witness whereof the said Solomon Blythe
 and Nancy his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year
