This Indenture made this 14th day of December in the year of our Lord 1830
between Solomon Blythe and Nancy his wife of the County of Southampton and State of
Virginia of the one part and William Davis of the aforesaid County and State of
the other part witnesseth that the said Solomon Blythe and Nancy his wife
in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars lawful money of Virginia then
in hand paid by the said William Davis at or before the ensaing and delivery
of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and
sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said William Davis his heirs
and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land together with all and singular the
appurtenances thereunto belonging Situate lying and being in the County aforesaid
and being the same wherein the said Solomon Blythe now resides containing one
hundred and fifty five acres be the same more or less but which will more fully and
larger appear by referring to a Deed from the Commissioners appointed by the Com^t Com^t Gen^t
of Southampton to make sale of the land formerly the property of John Francis deceased
to John Crichlow and from said John Crichlow to the said John Blythe junior
from the said John Blythe Jr to John Blythe for the first and bearing date
the 21st November 1808 the next bearing date 24th May 1809 and the last bearing date
21st of January 1811 references being had as aforesaid the boundaries of will
appear To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land together with all and
singular the appurtenances thereunto belonging unto him the said William Davis his
heirs and assigns to his and their use and behoof forever And the said Solomon Blythe
and Nancy his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract or parcel of Land
with all and singular the appurtenances unto the said William Davis his heirs
and assigns forever free from the claim of them the said Solomon Blythe and
Nancy his wife or either of them their or either of their heirs and of all and
every person or persons whatsoever I shall will and do warrant and forever
