Martha his wife for themselves and their heirs the said Land with all and singular
the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Joseph Petler his
heirs and affigis free from the claim or claims of them the said Thimleus M.
Bailey and Martha his wife or either of them their or either of their heirs and of
all and every person or persons whatsoeuer shall will and do evant and for

This Indenture made this 20th day of June in the year of our Lord 1831
Between Thomas Petler and Jane his wife of the County of Southampton of the one
part and Godwin Bradshaw of same County of the other part. Whereas of fact that
the said Thomas Petler and Jane his wife in consideration of the sum of
sixty dollars to them in hand paid by the said Godwin Bradshaw the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged have given granted bargained and sold unto the said
Godwin Bradshaw and his heirs one lot or parcel of Land lying on Black Creek
road and adjoining the lands of Lawrence Lyons and Willis Bowen by estimation
seven acres be the same more or less to have and to hold the said parcel of land
together with all and singular its appurtenances to him the said Godwin Bradshaw
and his heirs forever and the said Thomas Petler and Jane his wife their
heirs executors and administrators the said parcel of Land with all its appurtenances
to him the said Godwin Bradshaw his heirs and affigis shall and will remain to
