This Indenture made the 12<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year 1831 between William  
 Fines and Martha and his wife of the first part and John Williford of the second  
 part, all of the County of Southampton W<sup>m</sup>sa<sup>th</sup> that the said William Fines and  
 Martha and his wife in and satisfaction of the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars  
 to them in hand paid by the said John Williford or otherwise deemed before the mak-  
 ing and delivery of these presents do bargain and sell unto the said John Williford the  
 Down interest of Nancy Gaul late Nancy Phelps late widow of John Phelps and  
 being the lands sold by Edwin W. Gaul to the said Phelps containing one hundred and  
 twenty two and a half acres be the same more or less together with all and singu-  
 lar profits rents and appurtenances thereto and reversions and reversions in fee to one moiety  
 of said Land in right of said Fines as her portion of her father's land and the  
 portion and interest of Benjamin Phelps in right of his father John Phelps and  
 sold to said Fines by said Phelps and wife and now held as donee and
