This Indenture made and entered into this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of February in the year  
of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and thirty one. Between George Gray of the County  
of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part, Lewis Harris Justice of the  
County and State aforesaid of the second part and John Gray of the County and  
State aforesaid of the third part. Witnesseth that whereas the said George Gray  
is justly and lawfully indebted to the said John Gray in one written obligation from under  
the hand and seal of the said George Gray executed on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of February  
1831. for the sum of Four hundred and thirty six dollars and ten cents and  
on demand the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of February 1831. And the said John Gray being bound  
as security for the said George Gray in certain written obligations from under  
the hand and seal of the said George Gray and John Gray or, one executed  
to Lewis Harris on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of January 1831. and on demand the same time for three  
hundred and thirty three dollars and 10 cents one executed to Lucy Gray for one  
hundred and thirty two dollars two executed to Benjamin Williamson one executed  
to William A. Jones one executed to Jesse Houston one executed to Hon<sup>ble</sup> Lewis  
Harris dec<sup>d</sup> one executed to William A. Wardlaw one executed to G. T. Clark  
one executed to Henry Gray and one executed to Ezra Fudge the amount and time  
due not recollcted which the said George Gray is willing and desirous to discharge  
from this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of  
one dollar lawful money of Virginia to the said George Gray in hand paid by the  
said Lewis Harris at and before the making and delivery of these presents, the  
receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said George Gray hath given grant  
conveyance and sold and by these presents do give grant bargain and sell unto the said  
Lewis Harris his heirs and assigns for use the following negro slaves to wit Sampson  
Amos Jim Sam Peter Tom and all her increase Amy and all her increase  
and Kate and all her increase five feather Beds and furniture three head of horses  
one cow one mare one Broom horse and bay filly called Nancy and sixty dollars  
still upon the express condition for as much of the herein before mentioned property  
to be sold in case of default of payment of the before mentioned sum as will pay  
of and discharge the amount of monies herein before mentioned to the said John Gray  
with all and singular the said negro slaves together with all the other property  
herein before mentioned or in any wise appertaining unto the said George Harris  
in and to the said negro slaves and all other property herein before mentioned  
To have and to hold the aforesaid slaves and all the other property herein  
before mentioned unto the said Lewis Harris his heirs Executors adm<sup>s</sup> and assigns  
for use. And the said George Gray do for himself his heirs Executors adm<sup>s</sup> and assigns  
in manner and form following that is to say that the said George Gray hath made  
made and assigns the aforesaid negro slaves (namely) Sampson Amos Sam Peter  
Peter Jan and all her increase Amy and all her increase and Kate and all her  
increase and all the other property herein conveyed unto the said Lewis Harris his  
Executors adm<sup>s</sup> and assigns against all and every other person or persons who shall  
shall and will warrant and for use defend by these presents upon that condition  
that no action  
let and upon this express condition that if the said George Gray shall fail to
