To the County of Southampton of the first part, James Cooper of the said County of the
Cooper Thence second part and Benjamin Roe of the said County of the third part, Well Writely
Examined and returned that whereas the said George Expos in order to secure the payment of a debt due
to Benjⁿ. Roe of the County of Kingsville for twenty four dollars and five cents
by Benjⁿ. Williamson 25th day of December next and further to secure Benjamin Roe as himself
17th Oct. 1831- said Expos to William Davis for the debt aforesaid and in consideration of a debt due
to him in hand paid by the said James Cooper the receipt is hereby acknowledged
he the said George Expos hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents
doth grant bargain and sell unto the said James Cooper the following property to wit
one horse ten head cattle two feather Beds and furniture more head horse
one Cart and wheels one clock all my household and kitchen furniture
and plantation utensils also my Crops of all descriptions that I may make
the present year To have and to hold the said aforesaid property unto the said
James Cooper his heirs Executors and assigns forever Upon Trust nevertheless that the
said James Cooper shall permit the said George Expos to remain in possession of the
said property and take the profits thereof to his own use until default be made in
the payment of the said sum of twenty four dollars and five cents either in part
or in the whole and then upon further trust that he the said James Cooper his heirs
or assigns shall and will do soon after the happening of such default offering and
as he his heirs Executors or assigns or the said Benjamin Roe his heirs or assigns after
request sell the said property aforesaid for ready money at public auction or
having fixed the time and place of sale at their own discretion and give or pay out
thereof at three public places and out of the moneys arising from such sale shall
after satisfying the charges thereof and all other expenses attending the premises pay
to the said William Davis his heirs or assigns the above sum of twenty four dollars
and five cents with the interest that may accrue and the balance if any shall pay
to the said George Expos his heirs or assigns But if the whole of the said sum of
twenty four dollars and five cents with interest and other expenses shall not be
lawfully accrued shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said Benjamin Roe
