This Indenture made and entered into this 18th day of April 1831 Between John O'Camp of the County of Northampton State of North Carolina and Richard W. Jeffrys of the County and State aforesaid merchants and partners trading under the Firm and Style of Camp and Jeffrys of the first part Matthew Calvert of the County and State aforesaid of the second part and Salmon L. Simmers of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the third part Whereas it is that the said Salmon L. Simmers having become the security of said J. O. Camp on a Bond executed to the Commissioners named in a decree of Southampton County Court sitting in January for the purpose of a Slave named Jacob sold by said Commissioners and purchased by said John O'Camp which negro was sold by said Camp and the money arising from said sale was applied to the partnership transaction of said Camp and Jeffrys and the said Camp and Jeffrys being anxious to secure the said Simmers from any possible injury on said security steps and for and in the further consideration of one dollar to them in hand paid by the said Calvert at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold and delivered and by these presents with grant bargain freely delivered unto the said Matthew Calvert all the goods wares and merchandise which a certain William P. Williams now in the employ of said Camp & Jeffrys has in his possession and the said Camp and Jeffrys do agree the said goods wares and merchandise now in possession of said Williams and whereby conveying all worth more than four hundred dollars also a gray horse and waggon now in possession of William the Dealer To have and to hold the said goods and horse and Waggon to the said Matthew Calvert his heirs Executors and administrators against the claim of whom the said J. O. Camp and R. W. Jeffrys their heirs &c or the claim or claims of all and every person or persons whatever upon trust nevertheless that the said Matthew Calvert shall when required by the said Simmers after giving legal notice of the time and place of sale proceed to sell the property above conveyed for cash and after paying the debt for which the said Simmers is security for said Camp as of a dead and the costs of this Indenture pay over the balance if any to said Camp and Jeffrys full with whom of the parties have hereunto set their hands and seals this day and date above written
