Williams his heirs or assigns forever all that his moiety of an undivided share of Land descended to me by my father Richard Williams well containing by estimation two hundred and twenty five to be the same more or less bounded as follows to wit on East by John Davis land on the North by land of Edwin Dickins his and west by Robert G. Simmons land South by Robert Reeks Jr Land with all the appurtenances situated lying and being in the County of Southampton To have and to hold the said Land with the Tenements and all the singular tenures promises heretofore mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every rights members and appurtenances unto the said Nicholas C. Williams his heirs or assigns forever to and for the only proper use and service of him the said Nicholas C. Williams his heirs and assigns forever and the said John H.
