Bailey at or before the sealing and delivering this indenture do receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell all their right and Concern to the said Phinias M. Bailey and to his heirs and assigns forever all of the land and interest of the land belonging to the said James Gray and Eliza his wife lying in the County of Southampton formerly the land which John Woodard did acquire and possessed of containing twenty acres more or less and bounded as follows beginning at a dogwood shrub a corner between Henry A. Trotter and Thomas Trotter thence along a line of marked trees on all A. Trotter's line and Phinias M. Bailey's land on the South and West and on Thomas Trotter's land on the North to the beginning again with all trees woods underwoods both Commodities advantages hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said Land belonging or in any wise appertaining thereto and reserving remainder and remainders right and title and services if the said promises and every part thereof interest claim or demand whatsoe'er of them
