

near the Spring Grove containing Three hundred and sixty eight acres more or less and bounded as mentioned in the preparatory part of this Indenture which said land was devised by John Whitefield as herein before particularly described, also one bay three one cent and increase two or more acres one bushels and six pence and plough two and plough frame one cattle one horse & spring which first crop and then increase ploughing and casting ground To have and to hold all their right title and interest in and to the above said tract of land either in expectancy or fee simple as the case may be and the aforesaid chattel estates to the said William Cutler his heirs, Exors and adm^{rs} forever and the said Robert A Rogers and Lucy his wife do hereby for themselves their heirs or any person claiming under them forever quit claim to any right title or interest in and to the aforesaid tract of land either in expectancy or otherwise and its heirs and assigns do hereby their right and interests by it of what nature soever to have the said William Cutler and his heirs Exors or adm^{rs} forever. Upon this special trust and condition that if the said Robert A Rogers shall well and truly pay and discharge the aforesaid note amounting as aforesaid to seventy three dollars and fifty two cents with the interest which may thereon accrue on or before the 1st day of July next ensuing or whenever he may be lawfully required by the said Bennett K. Whitefield or his order or his assigns then this indenture and every thing herein contained to be void but if the said Robert A Rogers should fail at the time specified or whenever thereafter he may be required by the said Whitefield to pay and discharge the amount of the aforesaid note together with the interest which may thereon be due then the said William Cutler shall at the request of the said Bennett K. Whitefield set up and sell to the highest bidder for cash all the said Robert A Rogers and Lucy his wife right title and interest in the aforesaid tract of land together with the chattels etc etc aforesaid having previously given legal notice of said sale which is to be at any place designated by the said William Cutler and the proceeds of said sale to be by said William Cutler applied in the following manner: 1st pay and discharge the cost attendant on the execution of this trust 2nd pay and discharge the amount of the aforesaid note and together with the interest which may thereon accrue amounting as aforesaid to seventy three dollars and fifty two cents 3rd the balance if any pay over to the said Robert A Rogers or his heirs or assigns and the said Bennett K. Whitefield hereby commits to admit the aforesaid property to remain in such possession as they the said Rogers and wife now has or may hereafter have until the day of sale aforesaid and the said William Cutler hereby consents to perform what upon him these parties hath enjoined In testimony whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first herein written
