This Indenture made and entered into on this 14th day of March in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty one between William T. Bryant and Matilda Bryant his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Lewis Horrell of the said County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said William T. Bryant and Matilda his wife for and in consideration of the sum of seventy five dollars current money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Lewis Horrell at or before the making and delivery of this presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. Have granted, bargained and sold and by these presents they and each of them doth grant, bargain and sell unto and confirm unto him the said Lewis Horrell his heirs and assigns forever all their right title interest claim or demand of law and to a certain undivided tract or parcel of Land of which Drury Bryant father of the said Matilda died seized and possessed known by the name of the Henrich Plantation situate lying in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Luke containing by estimation One Hundred acres be the same more or less and bounded by the lands of said Lewis Horrell William Bryant and others together with all and singular the appurtenances belonging or in any wise appertaining to their said interest or proportionable part of the said tract or parcel of Land and promised to have and to hold the aforesaid right title and interest of them the said William T. Bryant and Matilda his wife of law and to the aforesaid undivided tract or parcel of Land unto him the said Lewis Horrell his heirs and assigns forever. And for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Lewis Horrell his heirs and assigns forever. And the said William T. Bryant and Matilda his wife for themselves their heirs executors and administrators do and each of them doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Lewis Horrell his heirs executors administrators and assigns that they will by their presents warrant and forever defend the right and title to the land hereby conveyed against the claims or demands of all and every person or persons whatsoever. In Witness whereof the said William T. Bryant and Matilda his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and date first within written signed sealed and delivered in presence of Jacob Barnes, J. P. S. W. T. Thomas Bryant
