Whitfield To Magd Trusts of Virginia of the first part, Many Magd^{Trusts} of the second part, and Lewis Worrell John Hargrave and Thomas B. Worrell of the third part all of the parties of the aforesaid to Jacob Jordan County of Southampton and state of Virginia Witness that whereas the said for Thomas B. Whitfield stands justly indebted unto the said Lewis Worrell by Bond bearing date January 18th 1830 for the sum of Forty three dollars to John Hargrave by Bond bearing date February 15th 1830 for the sum of forty three dollars and twenty Cents and to Thomas B. Worrell by Bond bearing date January 18th 1830 for the sum of forty three dollars the above sums being the amount the said Lewis Worrell John Hargrave and Thomas B. Worrell paid to Austin Middleton Coroner for said Whitfield (for) in an execution in favour of the estate of John Packham dec'd and he the said Whitfield being desirous and willing to secure the aforesaid debts and the interest thereon accruing back for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar Current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Many Magd^{Trusts} at or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, Hargrave his heirs and assigns and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell alien in fee simple and Confirm unto him the said Many Magd^{Trusts} his heirs and assigns forever the following personal property to wit two Jack planes three Fore planes one jointer two Carpenters adze's three Squares two augers one and 1/2 inch Box Chisels one smoothing plane five floor dogs three wide Chisels three small gouges two Hand Saws and one Back Saw one Broad axe and one Hatchett two Claw Hammers one Glue pot Lead, one Compass Saw one Plane and thirty Bits traversing plough and eight irons three scribing chisels and one fimer chisel one hand plane two large Rabbit planes two raising planes two corner tables two small Rabbit planes (square faces) two Adams cutting planes one circular saw
