This Indenture made and entered into on the 18th day of May in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty one Between William Stony and Polly Stony his wife of the County of Southampton and State of New York of the one part and John Whitfield of the same County and State of the other part. Whereas it is agreed that the said William Stony and Polly his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and Eighty two dollars and Fifty cent current money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said John Whitfield at or before the ensaing and delivery of these presents unto the receipt whereof witness present have granted bargained sold alimited enfranchised and confirmed and by these presents do and each of them doth grant bargain sell alimited enfranchised and confirmed unto the said John Whitfield his heirs and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton in the Parish of Saint Luke's containing by late Survey Ninety acres the same more or less to bring the land which the said William Stony purchased of Benjamin Jordan and others as will appear by reference being paid to the record in the Clerks Office and bounded as follows to wit Beginning in the centre of the Cypress road at a corner for Samuel Stony Williams Dick and Richard Jordan thence along said Samuel Stony's line of marked trees at 30 ft deep thence at 26 ft 10 1/2 inches at 16 ft 6 in 13 ft thence at 32 ft 11 1/2 ft to a black jack oak a corner for said Mills Johnson thence along said Mills Johnson's line 3 ft 9 1/2 in 11 1/2 poles to a corner in James Dick's line thence along said Dick's line 133 ft 6 1/2 poles to a pine tree at 34 ft 10 1/2 inches thence 128 ft 6 1/2 poles to a small pine a corner for Benjamin Dunn thence along said Dunn's line at 84 ft 6 1/2 poles to the aforesaid Cypress road thence along said road at 18 ft 4 1/2 poles to the first station together with all the right title interest claim or demand of me and to the above described tract or parcel of land and premises with all and singular its appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining To have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises with all and singular its appurtenances therunto belonging as before said unto the said John Whitfield his heirs and assigns forever to anfor-
