Act 27/1831

This Indenture made this sixth day of May in the year of our Lord 1831 between Richard Stichellson of the County Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and William Dunning of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Whom the said Richard Stichellson in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to him paid by the said William Dunning at or before the inscating and delivery of these presents doth bargained and sold unto the said William Dunning his heirs and assigns Contain tract a parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton the lightwood swamp and adjoining the the land of William M. Jones M. S. others containing three hundred acres more or less being the same land which first belonged to Andrew Jones dec^d and was sold by Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Southampton and James Jones became the purchaser thereof upwards 3000 & the same to Ralph Gravell as trustee to secure the payment of his to Thomas Simpson a/c of James Simpson dec^d who was guardian to Ralph Gravell by virtue of which said Deed in trust the said Ralph Gravell espouse his land to public sale and Thomas R. Gray became the purchaser thereof who sold and Conveyed the same to William C. Morris who afterward Conveyed the same to James P. Challe as Trustee to secure the payment of certain debts to them R. Gray by virtue of which said in trust the said James P. Challe espouse his land to public sale and Richard Stichellson became the purchaser thereof This Indenture witnesseth that the said Richard Stichellson for and in Consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars to him in hand paid by the said William Dunning have given bargained and sold unto the said William Dunning his heirs and assigns tract a parcel of land together with the appurtenances thereto belonging to my new appertaining To have and to hold the said piece of land hereinafter Conveyed together with its appurtenances to the said William Dunning and assigns forever and the said Richard Stichellson the said piece of land hereby Conveyed together with its appurtenances to the said William Dunning his heirs and assigns against the claim of the said Richard Stichellson his heirs and assigns and against all persons whom ever claiming by themselves or by their presents will form a covenant and defend In witness whereof the said Richard Stichellson hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day of June first mentioned
