Whitfield This Indenture made this 20th day of June in the year of our Lord Eighteen
 hundred and thirty one Between John Whitfield of the first part Edmund Thorpe
 Proprietor of the second part and Richard Jordan of the third part all of the County of Southampton
 Edmund Thorpe and Parish of Saint Luke's and State of Virginia. Whereas the said John Whitfield
 by his wife is justly indebted to the said Richard Jordan in the sum of Three Hundred and Fifty
 dollars and two dollars and fifty cents by Bond bearing record to and these presents which date
 this 30th day of March 1832 with the interest thereon according to the said John Whitfield so willing and desire
 to have. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the
 promised and also for the further Consideration of one dollar of lawful money for given
 to the said John Whitfield in hand paid by the said Edmund Thorpe at and before
 sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 he the said John Whitfield hath given granted bargained sold almed enfeoffed
 released and Conformed and by these presents doth give grant bargained sold almed
 enfeoffed released and Conformed to the said Edmund Thorpe his heirs and assigns forever
 all that tract or parcel of land and premises lying and being in the aforesaid County of
 Southampton and Parish of Saint Luke's containing by late Survey forty acres to
 the same more or less to bring the tract or parcel of land which the said John
 Whitfield purchased of William Story and wife as will appear by their Bill
 to said Whitfield bearing date on the 11th day of May 1831 and bounded by the W^E lines of
 Samuel Story, Mills Johnson Sam'l Dick, Benjamin Burns and Austin
 Jordan with all and singular the appurtenances to the said tract or parcel of land
 belonging or in any wise appertaining and all the estate right title and interest
 of the said John Whitfield in and to the said granted or intended to be freely
 granted tract or parcel of land and premises with its appurtenances thence belonging
 unto the said Edmund Thorpe his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns forever
 to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Edmund Thorpe his heirs Executors
 and assigns forever. And the said John Whitfield for himself his heirs Executors Administrators
 and heirs and assigns forever in manner and form following that is to say that he the said
 John Whitfield has his heirs and assigns the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises
 with its appurtenances unto the said Edmund Thorpe his heirs Executors Administrators
 and assigns forever whatsoever shall and will demand and affect
 against the claims or demands of all persons whatsoever shall and will demand and affect
 deford by these presents. Upon Trust moreover that the said Edmund Thorpe his
 heirs and assigns shall permit the said John Whitfield to remain in quiet and
 peaceable possession of the said tract or parcel of land and premises with its ap-
 pertenances thence belonging until default be made in the payment of the sum
 of Three Hundred and eighty two dollars and fifty cents either in the whole
 or in part and then upon this further trust that they or any two or three
