This Indenture made this 20<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord 1831  
Between John Whitfield of the first part Edmund Thorp  
of the second part and Richard Jordan of the third part all of the County of Southampton  
County of the Parish of Saint Luke and State of Virginia. When was the said John Whitfield  
by the said James C. Chubb  
this 30<sup>th</sup> day of  
March 1832  
is fully indebted to the said Richard Jordan in the sum of Three Hundred and Eighty  
two dollars and fifty cents by him bearing certificate with these presents which debt  
with the interest thereon accruing the said John Whitfield is willing and desires  
to secure. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the  
promises and also for the further consideration of one dollar of lawful money forgo  
to the said John Whitfield in hand paid by the said Edmund Thorp at and after the  
making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged  
he the said John Whitfield hath given granted, bargained sold aliened conveyed  
released and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien  
convey release and confirm to the said Edmund Thorp his heirs and assigns forever  
all that tract or parcel of land and premises lying and being in the aforesaid County of  
Southampton and Parish of Saint Luke's containing by late survey ninety acres  
the same more or less it being the tract or parcel of land which the said John  
Whitfield purchased of William Story and wife as well appear by their deed  
to said Whitfield bearing date on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of May 1831 and borne by the well be  
lieves of Samuel Story, Mills Johnson James B. C. Benjamin Rums and others  
Jordan with all and singular the appurtenances to the said tract or parcel of land  
belonging or in any wise appertaining and all the estate right title and interest  
of the said John Whitfield in and to the said granted or intended the Parish  
of Saint Luke and State of Virginia to be hereby granted and conveyed to the said Edmund Thorp  
granted tract or parcel of land and premises with its appurtenances and interests belong  
unto the said Edmund Thorp his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever to  
the only proper use and behoof of him the said Edmund Thorp his heirs Executors ad  
assigns forever. And the said John Whitfield for himself his heirs Executors ad  
assigns forever doth hereby covenant promise and agree to and with the said Edmund Thorp his  
Executors ad assigns forever in manner and form following that is to say that the said  
John Whitfield his heirs Executors ad assigns doth and does the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises  
with its appurtenances unto the said Edmund Thorp his heirs Executors ad assigns  
against the claim or demand of all persons whatsoever shall and lawfully demand and  
demand by these presents. Upon trust nevertheless that the said Edmund Thorp his  
heirs Executors ad assigns shall permit the said John Whitfield to remain in quiet  
peaceable possession of the said tract or parcel of land and premises with its ap  
purtenances until default be made in the payment of the sum of  
Three Hundred and Eighty two dollars and fifty cents either in the whole  
or in part and then upon that further trust that they or any two or either

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
