

of them or the survivor of them or the heirs Exec^{rs} adm^{rs} and assigns of such survivor shall and will do soon after the happening of such default of payment as they or any or either of them or the survivor of them or the heirs Exec^{rs} adm^{rs} or assigns of such survivor may think proper or the said Richard Jordan his Exec^{rs} adm^{rs} or assigns shall request sell the said tract of Land and premises with the appurtenances thereto belonging or such part of the hereby granted premises as the trustee or his representatives hereby authorized to act shall think sufficient for the purpose and shall think proper to sell to the highest bidder for ready money at public auction after having first the time and place of sale at his or their own discretion and giving fifteen days notice thereof by advertisement posted up at three or more public places in the County thereof and out of the moneys arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges thereof and all other expenses attending the premises pay to the said Richard Jordan his Exec^{rs} adm^{rs} or assigns the said sum of Three Hundred and Eighty two dollars and fifty cents with the interest which may thereon lawfully have accrued and the balance if any shall pay to the said John Whitfield his heirs Exec^{rs} adm^{rs} or assigns.
