This Indenture made and entered into this 27th day of September 1830 Between James Blon of the one part and Henry Blon of the other part both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesses that whereas Richard Blon by his last Will and Testament devised and bequeathed to James Blon Henry Blon Robert Blon and Samuel Blon children of Henry Blon dec^d his tract of Land lying in Southampton to be Equally divided between them the said James Henry Robert and Samuel at their mother's death and that event having taken place Robert died the adm^r of the said Henry Blon dec^d proc^d in order to make an equal division thereof on the day of to sell the said Land to the highest bidder whereupon Blon and Henry Blon two of the said Legatees became the purchasers thereof and joined which two they have by mutual consent had the said land divided between them that is the said James Blon and the said Henry Blon and the said James Blon more effectually to assure and secure to the said Henry Blon a good and lawful title the said part or parts of the said tract of Land which he had agreed to take in his equal proportion thereof do hereby agree to make a conveyance to him for the said

Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said James Blon for and in consideration of the premises aforesaid at well for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid the receipt whereof before the making and delivery of these presents is hereby acknowledged Have granted bargained and sold and do hereby these presents grant bargain and sell to him the said Henry Blon and his heirs and assigns forever two separate tracts parts or pieces of land being his equal division of the land which they jointly purchased from Robert Blon dec^d adm^r of Henry Blon dec^d lying and being in the County of Southampton near the Cypress Bridge the first of which pieces containing one hundred
