To have and to hold the aforesaid piece or parcel of land to him the said Samuel Blot and his heirs forever reserving to himself the said Henry Blot the aforesaid privileges and the said Henry Blot and Elizabeth his wife do for themselves their heirs and assigns quit all claim made the aforesaid reservation to the said land and claim acts and defend all their right and title stands to him the said Samuel Blot and his heirs and assigns forever In Testimony whereof the parties of the first part have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first above written

This Indenture made this 21st of June 1831 between Angus Byant and Elizabeth his wife of the first part and James F. French of the second part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of Seven Hundred dollars the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said Angus Byant and Elizabeth his wife have bargained and sold and conveyed and by these presents do sell and convey unto James F. French his heirs &c forever a certain tract or parcel of land purchased by said Byant & wife Goodrich containing two and a half acres of land lying in the County of Southampton adjoining Jerusalem Beginning at a post on the road about two hundred and twenty eight yard from the corner of piece lot thence back a straight line about at 800 yards and two yards to a post thence a straight line about at 14 to James Rockelle's line on the north side from the main road to the old race path To have and to hold the said two and a half acres of land unto the said James F. French his heirs and assigns forever the title whereof the said Angus Byant together with
