acknowledged the said James French hath bargained sold and conveyed and by these
presents doth sell bargain and convey unto Nicholas M. Schell his heirs and assigns
forever a lot situate and adjoining Paulsons' originally purchased of Robert Gordon con-
taining two and a half acres more or less Beginning at a post on the road about two
hundred and twenty yards from the corner of French lot thence back a straight line
about N. E. one hundred and five yards to a post thence a straight line about N. W.
to James Rockwell's line on the path leading from the main road to the old racefield
To have and to hold the said two and a half acres more or less unto the said Nicholas
M. Schell his heirs and assigns forever the title of which the said French
