entitled to that parcel belong to or was in the possession of Rachel Anderson (deceased) during her life
named as follows: Elah, Mimy, Sam, John Williams and Stephen to him the said John
Banitt and his heirs forever free from the claim of him the said Littlepage Anderson or his heirs &c
and free from the claim or claims of all and every person or persons whatsoever do by these presents
warrant and forever defend the right and title of the said negro slaves unto him the
