Mapentung in the sum of One Hundred dollars for the payment whereof he has executed his obligation or single bill bearing date with these presents with the said J. D. Mapentung bound thereunto as security and the said Thomas L. Jones being desirous to indemnify and secure the said James D. Mapentung against loss or injury by reason of his said debt or default. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and the further consideration of One dollar current money in hand paid by the said Thomas L. Jones to the said Lewis C. Truquant he the said Thomas L. Jones hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto him the said Lewis C. Truquant his heirs Executors administrators or assigns the following property to wit Three Horses Twelve Cows and twelve Hogs with their increase his house hold and kitchen furniture To Have and to hold unto him the said Lewis C. Truquant his heirs and assigns forever Upon trust nevertheless that the said Thomas L. Jones be permitted to hold possession of the said property and enjoy the use thereof until default be made in the payment of the before mentioned debt or some part thereof and then upon this further trust that he the said Lewis C. Truquant his Executors administrators or assigns will sell the same acquired by the said J. D. Mapentung his Executors administrators or assigns all said property or so much thereof as may be necessary to satisfy said debt or demand at public auction for cash money
