Day 15th of August A.D. 1831
I now all men by these presents that we James Davis Senior of the County of Lawrence and
State of Indiana Executor of the last Will and Testament of Drury Davis late of the County
of Elkhart Indiana aforesaid deceased and James Davis Senior of the County of Floyd Indiana state
aforesaid have empowers and ordained Constituted and appointed and by these presents do hereby
empower and ordain Constitute and appoint George Gay of the County of Southampton and State of
Virginia our true and lawful Agent and Attorney in fact for us and in our several names
on the 26th day of October 1831 to due or owing to each or either of us in any manner whatever from the following persons in the
County of Southampton aforesaid (to wit) the sum of Three hundred and thirty five dollars or there
about due from the estate of Thomas Bleath late of the County of Southampton aforesaid deceased
to the said James Davis Senior and also the sum of forty dollars or thereabouts due from Thomas
Gray of the County of Southampton aforesaid to the said James Davis Senior as such Executor
as aforesaid and also the further sum of One hundred dollars or thereabouts due from George
Branch of said County of Southampton to the said James Davis Senior as such Executor as
aforesaid And also as such agent and Attorney in fact as aforesaid to demand to demand as
for and receive from any person or persons whatever who may in any wise be indebted to the
said James Davis Senior as such Executor as aforesaid either in the County of Southampton
aforesaid or due where ever in the State of Virginia any and all sum or sums of money which in
any manner whatever may be due or owing to the said James Davis Senior as such Executor as
aforesaid And be it further known that the said James Davis Senior as such Executor as
aforesaid and the said James Davis Jr. have fully empowers and ordained Constituted and
appointed the said George Gay their agent and Attorney in fact for us and in our several
names or names aforesaid to ask for demand and receive the several sums of money herein
stated as aforesaid from the several persons herein mentioned and also in the collection thereof to
use and institute all means of any sorts for the recovery and collection of the same and in one
several name or names legally to receipt for any and all sums of money which our said attorney
as aforesaid for us in the premises herein may receive as amply and as fully to all intents
and purposes whatever we think we were proromately proromated to act in the premises
August 15th 1831.
