Ferguson of said County and State have on this 8th day of August 1831 Bargained and sold and do hereby grant bargain and sell unto him the said Richard B. Ferguson all my right title interest and estate in and to a certain negro girl named Will dec^d as her dower. To him the said Richard B. Ferguson and his heirs forever free from the claim of her the said Mary Will her heirs &c. and free from the claim and claims of all and every person or persons whatsoever do by these presents warrant and forever hereafter defend the right and title of my interest in the said negro slave unto him the said Richard B. Ferguson and his heirs forever In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written
